

Nobles All,

We have before us an opportunity to set our direction for this Shrine for many years to come. We have before us an opportunity to construct a new Temple and do so in the manner in which we choose. We do not have to purchase a building and then spend significant funds to make it to our use. We are not purchasing an old building and renovating it. We are constructing a new building and doing so for our specific use for many years to come. This is an opportunity to have your voice heard and vote to secure the longevity of our Shrine for many years to come. I am laying out the building and how we are going to pay for it for the next 20 years.

Specifics of the building

We have purchased 3 acres of property as an investment. WE paid approximately \$850,000 for this property. Given that in 7 parcels of property up and down Grand River, the next cheapest parcel was selling and did sell for \$376,000 per acre. We paid \$225,000 per acres. We got very lucky on this property. So, what can we do with this property?

We can construct a building, comprised of 15,000 square feet for our use, to be utilized as a Shrine Center for Moslem Shrine Temple. This building will be comprised of:

- 5 offices for the Divan, Recorder, Potentate, and 2 office workers.
- there will be a meeting room area for use by units wishing to meet.
- there will be a large main area for use during events that will seat 250 people
- there will be a bar area off the main room, divided by an air wall that will seat 120, in the main bar area, and additional 15 seats at the bar, for a combined seating of 370. Within the bar area, there are two large garage doors that open out to patio area that is partially covered with a roof.
- There is a storage area to the southeast that has ample room for storage.
- There are a men's and ladies bathroom with ample stalls for both.
- The 3 acre parcel will host 150 parking spaces as required by the City of Novi
- There will be a joint retention pond to the north, shared with Suburban Collection Showplace
- Utilities for this project will be a joint effort with Suburban Collection Showplace and hookup to the utilities are to the east of the property.

This is Moslem Shrine's opportunity to construct a building designed for its specific use and will be a model for other Shrines to emulate. This is our opportunity to make a home for ourselves for many, many years to come. Now, here is how we can pay for this for the next 20 years.

Financing this project

One of the big questions is how do we pay for this project. Well, we could pay cash. Moslem has ample cash to pay for this project in full, up front, with funds in the building account and the parking lot account. To do so, we would be taking investment money that we on average earn 12% on annually, and have over the course of the past 10 years.

Or, we can borrow from the bank at 6.25% and keep our money for our use. We retain our asset, our cash. We give the bank a first position mortgage on this building.

Here are the points of the financing proposal for Nobles to approve at the vote on April 17.

Building account balance \$2,200,000 Down payment/property purchase

> Lot 1-2acres \$450,000 Lot 2-1acres \$400,000 Site plan work \$150,000

Total down payment \$1,000,000

Balance remaining in the building account after down payment \$1,200,000

The remaining funds in the building account will be pledged as an asset to the bank. We cannot touch this money once pledged under any circumstances. This money will be used to make our payments over the next 6 years.

This \$1,200,000 will make our payments on this loan for the next 6 years. Our payments are approximately \$23,000 per month and each month the bank will take out this amount from our pledged building fund account. WE DO NOT HAVE TO SPEND ANY MONEY FROM OUR OPERATING BUDGET FOR THIS LOAN UNTIL 2029.

WE HAVE ENOUGH TO COVER OUR PAYMENTS FOR 6 YEARS. WE ARE BORROWING THE MONEY FOR 5 YEARS.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER 5 YEARS. AT 5 YEARS WE CAN:

- REFINANCE OUR BUILDING FOR ANOTHER 5 YEARS WITH OUR BANK OR ANOTHER BANK DEPENING ON OFFERS WE RECEIVE
- LOOK AT THE POSITION OF THE SHRINE AT THAT TIME AND DECIDE WHAT WE WISH TO DO

THERE IS NO COMMITMENT TO DO ANYTHING. WE MAY AT THE 5 YEAR MARK WISH TO MOVE AS THIS BUILDING WILL NOW BE WORTH SUBSTANTIALLY MORE THEN WE HAVE PAID FOR IT. EVERYTHING HERE DEPENDS ON THE SHRINE AND THE DIVAN AT THE TIME

IF WE WISH TO REFINANCE, WE CAN DO SO AT A VARIETY OF LOCAL BANKS OR SIMPLE RENEW OUR MORTGAGE WITH OUR BANK. IT WILL BE UP TO THIS SHRINE. IN COMMERCIAL LENDING, IE. BUILDING FINANCING, IT IS IN THE ORDINARY COURSE OF BUSINESS TO FINANCE A LOAN FOR A 5 YEAR PERIOD WITH THE PAYMENT BEING CALCULATED OVER 20 YEARS. THIS IS CALLED A 5/20 LOAN. IT IS TOTALLY NORMAL.

ADDITIONALLY, IF INTEREST RATES DROP DURING OUR LOAN PERIOD, OUR BANK WILL REFINANCE THIS BUILDING TO THE LOWER INTEREST RATE WITH NO COST TO US.

- Should the Divan wish to refinance this building at year 5, we have one more year of building money in our account.
- In year 6 through 10, funds for this mortgage will come from an increase in the Michigan State Fair income to the Shrine which is projected to increase over \$150,000.
- additionally, we have not had an in-person summer Sportsman Raffle in the past 3 years nor any income from this raffle to speak of. In discussion with Mike Zelmanski, he feels

that the new summer Sportsman Raffle in this new building will produce at a minimum \$80,000 in annual income.

- This is a total of \$230,000 to apply toward this new mortgage in year 6 through 10.
- If we refinance in 5 years, our new payment will be \$19,000 per month or \$228,000 annually
- Our new revenue will be producing \$230,000, enough to cover our mortgage

Some have asked about property taxes. We would have to pay property taxes on any building we acquire. In this case taxes are anticipated to be \$50,000, to \$65,000 per year.

Operating budget-some have asked about an operating budget. This again is a cost that we will incur with any building we purchase or build. I can say that it will be substantially less on a new building than on an older one.

Gentlemen, We have an opportunity here to construct a building designed for our purposes.

We have set aside the money to pay for it over the next 20 years.

We have addressed how to pay for it after 6 years and in years 7 through 10 and longer going forward


We have addressed how to refinance the building if we so desire and how we will pay for it

We have a once in a lifetime opportunity here to create our own home with no remodel, no revamp, no alteration. Our future is in your hands now and I sincerely hope you see the value in the building and vote yea for its acceptance.

This building is the future of Moslem Shrine Temple.



April 17, 2023, at 7:00 PM




MESSAGE FROM OUR POTENTATE

MESSAGE FROM OUR RECORDER

From the Desk of the Recorder Some History from the Shrine Imperial Sessions

What is the Imperial Session?

Every summer, Shriners from around the world come together for their annual business meeting, known as the Imperial Session. During the week-long event, held in a different host city each year, members meet to discuss and vote on business matters of Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. The fraternity also hosts a variety of fun events including a parade and unit competitions. Other traditional events include a pageant for the incoming Imperial Potentate and the debut of the new patient success video and introduction of the National Patient Ambassadors.

History of Imperial Session

1876

The first Imperial Session was held in the Masonic Hall in New York City with only 20 Nobles in attendance. It was at this meeting that a group of men were endowed with rights and privilege to advance the "Order of the Mystic Shrine" and create subordinate Temples. A fee of \$50 was instituted for the charter of a new Temple with \$10 annual temple tax to the Imperial Council. Dr. Walter M. Fleming was appointed the Grand Imperial Potentate and he, along with three other members, formed the Imperial Grand Council of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine for the United State of America.

1877

The legend of the origins of the fraternity began at the 2nd Imperial Session held at the Masonic Temple in Albany, New York. It was here that the near-Eastern theme of the Shriners was established. The costumes and of the jewels of the Imperial and subordinate officers were prescribed, and each temple was required to adopt an Arabian or Egyptian name.

1886

The 11th Imperial Session was held in Cleveland, Ohio, the first to be held outside of New York state. Sam Briggs of Al Koran Shriners was elected Imperial Potentate, only the second in the organization's history.

1887

The grandeur, festivities and tradition of the Imperial Session began at this session in Indianapolis, Indiana. Three hundred nobles attended a banquet that *Indianapolis News* said was "the most elaborate ever laid in Indiana." It was followed by a procession of Shriners in fezzes and evening attire to the Scottish Rite temple.

1888

The 13th Imperial Session was held in Toronto, Ontario, Canada where Rameses Shriners had just been chartered the year before. Shriners, and for the first time, their ladies arrived in Toronto by the hundreds on trains. Rameses rented a Lake Steamer for moonlight cruises on Lake Erie.

1900

At the 26th Imperial Session in Washington, D.C., an Arabic band marched Imperial Potentate John H. Atwood to the headquarters hotel where the proceeded to play for hours in the lobby. This established the ongoing tradition of bands playing in the hotels at Imperial Session.

1907

During the 33rd Imperial Session in Los Angeles, California sightseeing train derailed and crashed, killing 31 and injuring 20 Nobles and their ladies, mostly from Rajah Shriners.

1917

Due to the United States' impeding involvement in the first World War, the 43rd Imperial Session in Minneapolis, Minnesota was dedicated solely to business. Many temple units which had raised funds for their trip turned them over to various was relief societies.

MESSAGE FROM OUR RECORDER Continued...

1918

During the 44th Imperial Session in Atlantic City, New Jersey, a German submarine took over a passenger steamer and ordered all aboard onto small boats. One boat made it to the coast of Atlantic City, and Shriners in full regalia waded into the ocean to help pull the boat to shore.

1920 - 21

At the 46th Imperial Session in Portland, Oregon, Past Imperial Potentate Freeland Kendrick proposed that the Shriners build a hospital for children. A committee was chosen to determine the site and personnel for the first Shriners Hospital. After month of work, research and debate, the committee concluded that there should not be just one hospital, but a network of hospitals throughout North America. When the committee brought the proposal to the 47th Imperial Session in Des Moines, Iowa, it too was passed.

1945

Due to World War II, the 71st Imperial Session in Chicago, III. was only attended by the Imperial Divan and necessary members of various committees.

1949

President and Shriner Harry S. Truman spoke to the crowd about foreign policy at the 75th "Diamond Jubilee" Imperial Session in Chicago, Illinois.

1966

Against the wishes of the Secret Service, both President Lyndon B. Johnson and Vice President H. Hubert Humphrey and their wives appeared together with Shrine leadership at the 92nd Imperial Session in Washington, D.C.

1982

The Imperial Session is held in Orlando, Florida for the first time. Shriners and their families spent an evening at Walt Disney World and the motor corps competitions were held at Sea World.

1989

The Peace Monument, donated to the city of Toronto in 1930 by the Shriners, was rededicated at a sunrise ceremony.

1999

The Hella Shrine Band hosted a musical reenactment of the famous "bubbles" speech at the 125th Imperial Session in Dallas, TX. This moving speech was given by Forrest Adair at the 1920 Imperial Session and it persuaded the representatives to pass legislation to create the hospital system.

2020

Imperial Session scheduled for July 5 – 9 in Kansas City, Missouri, was cancelled due to the COVED-19 global pandemic.

2020

In response to the cancellation of the 146th Imperial Session in Kansas City, a virtual Special Session of Shriners International and Special Meeting of Shriners Hospital for Children was held. The event was live streamed to temples around the world. The election of Imperial Officers and Trustees and two other proposed legislation items were done electronically.

In the late 1910s, as a polio epidemic swept across the United States, it was apparent that many children were going without appropriate care. So, the Shriners established a children's hospital to meet this need.

On May 12, 1922, thousands gathered to witness the placing of the cornerstone of the first Shriners Children's hospital, in Shreveport, Louisiana. The first patient – a little girl with clubfoot – was seen on Sept. 16, 1922, in a remodeled home adjacent to the Masonic temple while construction of the permanent hospital was underway.

What began as a single hospital is now a world-renowned and beloved healthcare system with hospitals, outpatient clinics, ambulatory care centers and outreach locations across the globe. We are now providing hope and healing to more children in more places.

Today, Shriners Children's offers care for a range of orthopedic issues, as well as care for burn injuries, craniofacial conditions, spine care and spinal cord injuries, colorectal and gastrointestinal care, and sports medicine. All family members who are Shriners are eligible to become part of the Legacy Program. To make the registration process easy, only one member of the family's legacy needs to register on Shriners Village. When logging in to your account on shrinersvillage.com, click on the "Membership" tab on the top of the web page. From this page, select "Legacy Program" on the left-hand side of the screen.

Each Legacy can download a certificate signed by the Imperial Potentate and Imperial Recorder. Shriners and their registered relatives can also order a special gold Legacy pin. Any new Shriners Legacy is eligible to receive a free pin for himself and up to two of his Shrine legacies. Nobles who became Shriners legacies prior to Jan. 1, 2012, are encouraged to become part of Shriners Legacy Program; these nobles may order a Legacy pin and certificate for themselves and their legacies for a contribution of \$5 or more per pin.
